	The Centre Leader informed the members that the ACE meetings which held in	34
	Djibouti, East Africa on February 18, 2019 was good exposure to some	35
	issues/information concerning the project. He stated that the ACE-FUELS proposals	36
	were considered good but the Centre needed a plan of action in order to receive	37
	funding from the World Bank. He mentioned that for the project to thrive, every	38

member of the Management Team had to be familiar with the vision of the project and be ready to work assiduously to move the Centre forward.

He reported that the World Bank made it clear that there should be two (2) teams for the project -i) **Academic/Research Team ii) Administrative Team**. He also stated that the World Bank was interested in the administrative team, especially the areas of monitoring & evaluation, procurement and finance. He also informed the Team that the World Bank made it clear that there would be no honorarium or salaries for staff.

He stated that they were reminded that it was requisite that as a Centre of Excellence we should be exemplary, doing things on time and always improving as the idea was to impact on the society. He stressed that the key output of the programme was to "deliver excellent education using excellent faculty based on excellent administration in an excellent environment".

The Centre Leader further stated that the World Bank expected ACEs to:

- i. Commercialize research.
- ii. Improve existing programmes and introduce new ones.
- iii. Increase enrollment of female students.
- iv. Attract regional students (30%).
- v. Collaborate with partners on campus, industries, national and regional.
- vi. Ensure quality.
- vii. Be transparent at every level.

43.02 ACE-IMPACT DLIS

The Centre Leader informed the members that the World Bank advised that the work plan for this first year should reflect how much the Centre would want to make in the next year. He also underscored the fact that the funds for the grant must be earned by achieving the milestones on the DLIs.

He pointed out that the **DLI 1** was for **basic readiness** pertaining to the Financial Reports, Procurement Manuals and **full readiness** involving a functional website with information about the Team, Guidance Counselor (the Environmental and Social Safeguard Officer), Student Affairs (the International Officer) and students' academic handbook. He stated that once these requirements were met, the Centre would receive the first tranche of funds from World Bank.

To earn the funds for DLI 1, the Centre Leader stated that the basic requirement was the **Implementation Plan** which had to be completed and sent to the NUC and World Bank within the month. He also mentioned that the NUC advised Centres to set minimal/reasonable targets which may be exceeded in time. He stated that it was also a requirement by the World Bank to invite the Advisory Board physically, to approve the plan for the DLI 1.
